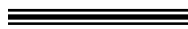

Proper methods of using and caring for equipment are presented. Environments that require SCBA use are reviewed and procedures for donning, doffing, inspecting, maintaining SCBAs and changing SCBA cylinders are presented.</p> <p>Class will include exercises utilizing the new Clearwater Fire Academy Confidence Trailer.
